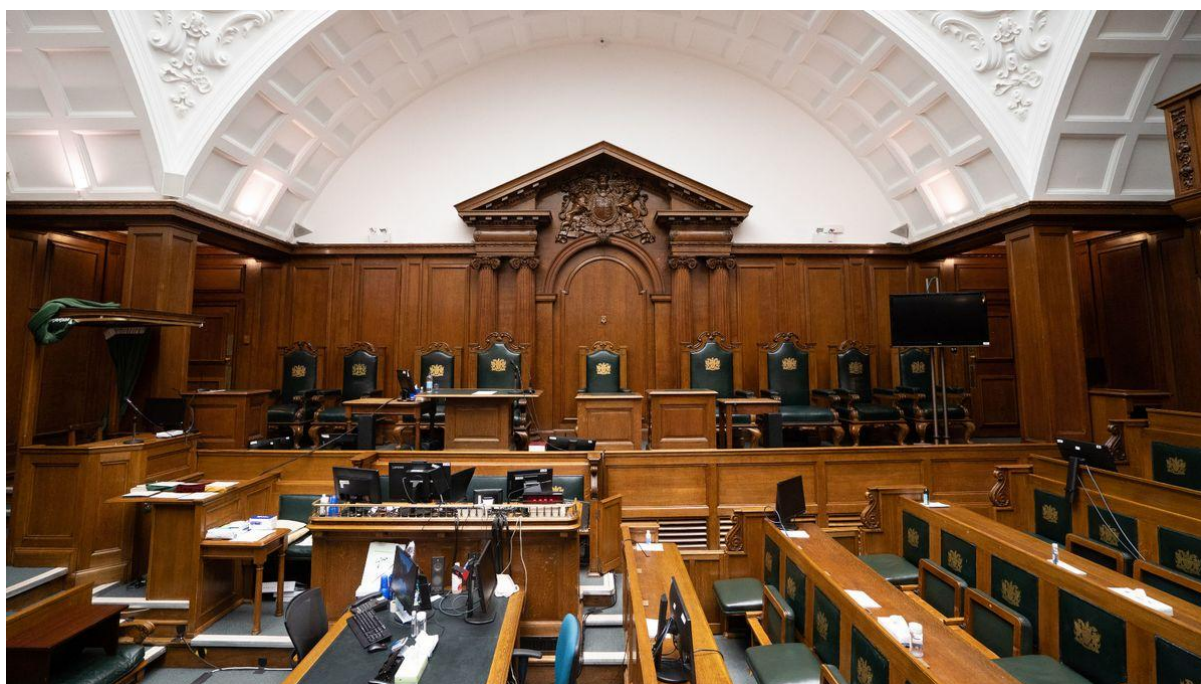

Tax barristers are regularly instructed to act for both taxpayers and HMRC in relation to tax appeals, disputes and investigations across all areas of tax law, including direct tax, VAT and customs and excise matters. A barrister expert in taxation is your best chance of gaining relatively worthy advice. Barristers are very knowledgeable in taxation, and they will have the essential understanding to advise you on anything tax related. A barrister with land and property experience can provide opinions on various aspects of SDLT including MDR claims, pre-completion transactions and incorporations. A number of well-versed barristers are instructed by solicitors, chartered accountants and other professionals under Licensed Access. They are also able to accept Instructions under the Direct Access scheme. In most cases tax havens are better described as secrecy jurisdictions. They are places that intentionally create regulation for the primary benefit and use of those not resident in their geographical domain, that regulation being deliberately designed to undermine the legislation or regulation of another jurisdiction. Although a barrister's work will vary considerably depending on their level of expertise and the area of law in which they practice, they will typically advise clients on the law and the strength of their case and provide them with a written 'opinion'.



Experienced tax experts could advise on trust deeds. If an individual transferred their employment income to a company and did not subsequently withdraw it by way of salary or dividend, then under flat tax proposals that income would go completely untaxed for as long as it remained within the company, which could be for an indefinite period. Tax affects almost all aspects of pension scheme operations, from investment to accrual and benefit design. Whilst pension funds are exempt from many aspects of tax, they can still face tax complexity. In order to be considered for direct access, you will need to organise all the relevant paperwork and evidence yourself and be able to explain the basics of your case to a

barrister. In some cases, it may be advisable to use the Public Access Legal Support service (PALS) – a specialised paralegal resource designed for barristers and clients who work together within the framework of the public access scheme. Increased Risk

Experienced tax experts are able to advise on public access rules. Tax law is the practice of law that relates to the assessment and payment of taxes. A barrister with expertise in real estate tax can give advice in relation to artificial transactions in land implications of acquisition, development and disposal by UK and non UK clients. Tax experts have in-depth knowledge of all aspects of cross-border investment; the laws of multiple jurisdictions; and the use of offshore trusts and corporate structures for asset protection, privacy, security and how these issues relate to a business. Addressing indirect taxes early with adequate planning can improve cash flow and mitigate absolute costs and risk exposure to additional tax, interest and penalties, income tax audits, and litigation. Barristers (who are also referred to as “counsel”) are independent specialists in court work and legal advice. There are specialist barristers in tax, super and associated areas of law. VAT, customs and duties are all areas that tax barristers can accept instructions in. The leading tax barristers practise mainly in all aspects of direct and indirect tax and business rates. Practice in this area requires a thorough knowledge of other areas of the law including: company, trust, contract, land, international and conflict of laws. Barristers with a tax specialism work with large-scale corporate litigation in the higher courts to advisory work on complex personal tax planning. Members of chambers regularly receive instructions from solicitors and accountancy firms of all sizes (from the Magic Circle solicitors and the Big Four accountants to high street advisors), trust companies and directly from in-house professionals from a wide variety of industries. Contributions to a registered pension can reduce the amount of tax you pay by extending your income tax rate bands. There are complex rules setting and reducing the annual allowances for such contributions and there are punitive tax charges for breaching those limits.
